Stage set for Puri Ratha Yatra festival

Puri, June 30 (UNI) The stage is set for the annual Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath, His elder brother Lord Balabhadra and sister devi Subhadra scheduled to begin on Friday. Lord Jagannath along with His siblings and accompanied by Sudarshan, Madanmohan and Ramakrishna will embark on a nine-day sojourn to Gundicha temple riding three separate chariots along a three-km long route. Many writers describe the Gundicha temple as His aunt's house. However, noted research scholar Dr.Surendra Mishra, citing a number of old scriptures says the journey of the Lord Jagannath is from Ratna Vedi to Yajna Vedi where the Lord manifested. After Pujapanda servitors handed over Ajnamallyas to the Biswakarmas of three chariots on Thursday police personnel and some devotees pulled the three chariots. — Nandighosh first followed by Darpdalan and then Taladhawaj from the construction yard and parked them facing the east in front of the Simhadwar. The three chariots are almost complete. On Friday servitors will fix Kanak mundi to each chariot and then lord Hanuman will be placed on it before the Chakra and the flag is fashioned to the mast. Srimandir purohit will organise a homa (offerings made directly to the fire) on Friday to consecrate the three chariots and parswa debatas (guarding deities) nine in each chariots before the Lord takes a seat on the chariot. A special set of servitors will



fix ladders to each chariot to facilitate the Pahandi of deities. Inside the Srimandir Daita servitors, soon after the public viewing closed at about 5 PM on Thursday, dressed up the deities in appropriate travel clothes. They also fixed Chhena patta and Bahuta Kanta (kind of body armors) to Trinity before Pahandi begins. The festival will begin on Friday morning with priests performing Mangal arati at 6 AM ,Mailum, Tadap lagi, Abakash, Surya pooja, Dwarpal puja and Rosahoma. Thereafter deities will be offered Sakal dhupa. After performing Mangalarpan Daita servitors will escort the deities in Pahandi procession to their respective chariots. The procession which is scheduled to begin by 8 AM is expected to be completed by 11.30 PM. Gajapati Dibyasingh Deb will perform Chherapahana service. It will begin by 2.30 PM and be over by 3.30 PM . Thereafter ascribed wooden horses will be fixed to three chariots and ladders will be dismantled. As per the Srimandir schedule pulling is to begin by 4 PM. The administration is hopeful that things may be advanced as everything is running ahead of the scheduled time. New Delhi, June 30 (UNI) Congress MP Rahul Gandhi on Thursday expressed grief over the loss of lives due to a landslide in Noney district of Manipur. He also prayed for speedy recovery for those injured. Writing to twitter, the former Congress president wrote, "The news of a tragic landslide near Tupul Yard railway construction camp in Noney District, Manipur is extremely distressing."

"My condolences to the bereaved families who have lost their loved ones and prayers for speedy recovery of those injured," he said. Eight persons including two Territorial Army (TA) personnel were killed, 23 rescued and around 50 people reported missing due to a massive landslide near Tupul Yard railway construction camp on Wednesday midnight in the Noney district.

Ek Nath Shinde takes oath as new Maha CM Devendra Fadnavis as his deputy

Mumbai, June 30 (UNI) The political turmoil, which has been going on for the last 10 days, finally came to an end on Thursday evening, as former Shiv Sena leader Eknath Shinde took oath as 20th Chief Minister Maharashtra, while Devendra Fadnavis was sworn-in as the Deputy Chief Minister. Within 24 hours of the resignation of Uddhav Thackeray, Shinde and Fadnavis took oath in a low-key function held at the Durbar Hall of the Raj Bhavan here. Governor Bhagat Singh Koshiyari administered the oath to both Shinde and Fadnavis in Marathi. "With the blessings of Hindu Heart Emperor Balasaheb Thackeray and Dharmaveer Anand

Dighe, I am taking the oath of Chief Minister of Maharashtra," said Shinde, during his oath-taking ceremony. During the swearing-in ceremony, slogans of 'Jai Bhavani, Jai Shivaji and Jai Shriram' filled the Raj Bhavan. Besides Governor Koshiyari and Dy CM Fadnavis, BJP state president Chandrakant Patil, Ashish Shelar, Pankaja Munde and other BJP leaders were present on the occasion.

Eknath Shinde's family also attended the swearing-in ceremony. The former Shiv Sena leader, who was instrumental in the fall of Maha Vikas Aghadi government in the state, was provided with 'Z' security, due to a wave of anger among the



Uddhav Thackeray loyalists over his rebellion. Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated both the Chief Minister and his Deputy on Twitter. "I would like to congratulate Shri@mieknathshindeji on taking oath as Maharashtra CM. A grassroots level leader, he brings with him rich political, legislative and administrative experience. I am confident that he will work

towards taking Maharashtra to greater heights," he tweeted. "Congratulations to Shri @Dev_Fadnavis Ji on taking oath as Maharashtra Deputy CM. He is an inspiration for every BJP Karyakarta. His experience and expertise will be an asset for the Government. I am certain he will further strengthen Maharashtra's growth trajectory," he said in another

tweet. BJP national president JP Nadda, in a series of tweets in Hindi, said "I congratulate Eknath Shinde and Devendra Fadnavis. This has been proven now that BJP was never hungry for the Chief Minister's post. In 2019 elections, (Prime Minister) Narendra Modi ji and Devendraji got a clear mandate. However, Uddhav Thackeray, in the greed of Chief Ministership, left us and formed the government with the opposition.

"BJP decided to support Eknath Shinde ji, for the betterment of people of Maharashtra. Fadnavis ji has also decided to join the Cabinet with a big heart, which shows his attachment to the people of Maharashtra. The party

has once again proved by taking this decision that we don't run after plum posts, but our ultimate goal is to serve the country and the people of Maharashtra under the leadership of Narendra Modi ji," he added. Odisha figures among six achiever states: Report

Bhubaneswar, June 30 (UNI) Odisha has been categorised among the six "Achiever" states along with industrially developed states like Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, according to the Business Reforms Action Plan (BRAP) 2020 assessment report released by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) on Thursday. Odisha government sources here said, the Union Finance Minis-

ter Nirmala Sitharaman, Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Textiles Piyush Goyal and senior officials from DPIIT were present on the occasion. BRAP 2020 was the fifth edition of the reform exercise. It had 301 reforms spread over 15 reform themes and over 40 reform areas, which drove transformation in digitization, transparency, and investor confidence in the country.

Odisha has shown remarkable progress in the current cycle by implementing over 90 percent of the 301 reforms suggested by DPIIT and achieving more than 80 percent of positive user feedback. Some of the major reforms carried out in the cycle by the state included setting up the new par-E-shram portal, a one-stop-shop for all services being provided by Labour and ESI Department as well as integration of the same with

GO-SWIFT portal, auto-renewal through online payment and elimination of renewal of 8 B2G services, digitization of land records, online systems for drug licenses, environmental clearances, digitisation of excise services. The state has also upgraded its Single Window System GO SWIFT with best-in-class features like unified payment system with a trickle feed mechanism, a single application for 54+

G2B services, an online document archival facility, an online grievance redressal mechanism and integration with the National Single Window System (NSWS).

Further, along with the reforms being carried out under the BRAP exercise, the Odisha government has also undertaken major reforms in the mining sector, measures to minimise burdensome regulatory compliances and it has also brought

in over 400 services under the Odisha Right to Public Services Act 2012 so as to ensure time-bout delivery of G2B and G2C Services. Consistent implementation of reforms over the last few years has enabled Odisha in attracting broad-based investments in multiple sectors including metal downstream, chemicals & petrochemicals, textiles & apparel, food processing and tourism.

Governor inaugurated National Rath Yatra Service Camp

Puri, June 30 (TNB): Like every year, this year, the Rath Yatra National Service Camp, sponsored by the Odisha State Bharat Scouts and Guides, is being held at the Puri Bishwambar Vidyapeeth premises from 28th June to 2nd July 2022. More than 500 rovers, rangers, scouts and guides from different districts are participating in the service and providing various services to the devotees.

Governor of Odisha, Prof. Ganeshi Lal officially inaugurated the camp by lighting a lamp on Thursday. The inaugural function presided over by Dr. Kaliprasad Mishra, State Chief Commissioner and



National Vice President, was attended by Minister for Schools and Mass Education Sameer Ranjan Dash as the guest of honor in the presence of State Secretary Sarat Chandra Paikrai. Minister Mr. Dash advised Rovers and Rangers to provide appropriate services to the pilgrims.

On Srigundicha Day, scouts, guides, rovers and rangers to divide into different groups to control

vehicles in various parts of the city, distribute drinking water to the devotees, spray water on them, provide first aid, and provide clean India service to them.

The camp was presided over by Biswajit Ghosh, District Education Officer, Puri District, and Managed by Mihir Ranjan Patnaik, Joint Secretary, State President Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak praised the children's service.

Centre deploys abundant medicos, set-up hospitals to assist Amarnath Yatra devotees

New Delhi, June 30 (UNI) A sleuth of measures have been taken to allow devotees taking Amarnath Yatra to have access to the medical and healthcare facilities, the Union Health Ministry said on Thursday. The Ministry said it has deployed medical professionals both from Central Government and State Government to assist the devotees during their journey which started today onwards. For this, state governments have been informed about the required arrangements along with medical preparation including services of specialist doctors, as well as General Duty Medical Officers (GDMOs) to supplement the efforts of the Jammu & Kashmir

Government, particularly by those States from where large numbers of pilgrims arrive, it added. "For attending medical emergencies, health professionals including doctors and paramedics will be deployed in batches. The first batch commenced on 25th June 2022 - 13th July 2022. Second and third batches would start from 11th July 2022 - 28th July 2022 and 26th July 2022 - 11th August 2022," the Union Ministry said in its statement.

According to the Union Health Ministry, the Gov-

ernment of J&K through the Director Health Services (DHS Kashmir) had requested 155 medical personnel (87 doctors, 68 paramedics) from Central Government Hospitals and CGHS. "Medical professionals are being deployed from Central Government hospitals and CGHS. In total, 176 nominations (115 doctors and 61 paramedics) have been received from the Centre-run hospitals and the CGHS. The complete list has been communicated to DHS Kashmir for further deployment," the ministry officials informed.

from the integrated control room. A comprehensive traffic mobility plan is to be implemented. An ambulance corridor alongside the Badadanda will be created. About five hundred lifeguards are deployed along the Puri beach for rescue and to prevent drowning in the sea. The railway has also deployed a good number of RPF and GRP personnel for the annual event. As directed by the Railway Minister, A tent for accommodating 15000 pilgrims has been raised in the Railway station complex. A number of EV vehicles will cater to the needs of elderly and differently-abled devotees from the platform to the taxi stand. Food court and free food packets for the needy will be served in the huge tent which is equipped with all basic amenities.

Apart from regular trains, 200 special DMUs will ply to Puri from different locations. The health department has beefed up its bed capacity by 200 beds with sunstroke treatment cabins. 220 doctors and paramedical staff have been deputed by the department to Puri for the fete. Three high-level review meetings for the festival was held last one was virtually addressed by the Chief minister. After much hue and cry over the ongoing Srimandir parikrama project, its replica has been created on the Southern side within the Parikrama limits to sensitise visitors about the corridor project. The footfall of devotees to witness Nabajouban Veshha on Thursday was less than on Wednesday. According to Srimandir PRO J.Mohanty while about 50,000 devotees visited the pilgrim city on Wednesday about 40,000 visited on Thursday which was less than their expectation. The PRO said nitee and rituals are running as per schedule and hoped that the Ratha Yatra would be celebrated smoothly.

HCCB to partner in helping toward plastic and litter-free Ratha Yatra with a mega waste management drive

Bhubaneswar, June 30 (TNB): Hindustan Coca-Cola Beverages (HCCB), one of India's top FMCG companies, will conduct a major plastic waste management drive at the Ratha Yatra that starts in Puri. The company will also create awareness towards responsible waste disposal during the festival. This year's Ratha Yatra is expecting a footfall of around 20 lakh devotees. HCCB along with its partners expect to collect 10 metric tons of plastic waste at this 15-day event.

In line with its vision of a World Without Waste, HCCB will install 4 helpdesks, and 40 garbage collection bins along the Ratha Yatra route and in

other parts of the city. This will help devotees dispose of plastic waste responsibly. HCCB and its partners will also deploy volunteers to manage any additional littered waste and to inform the devotees, restaurant & hotel owners etc. about the need for waste segregation and responsible waste disposal. The helpdesks and collection bins will be placed at the entrance to the festival site, the exit towards Marine Drive, Puri bus stand and railway station, the 'Bada Danda' road between the Jagannath Temple and Sri Gundicha temple (Cart festival site), hotels and dharmshalas.

Additionally, volunteers



will reach out to residential welfare societies, marketplaces, civil society bodies and elected representatives of the local municipality to drive awareness for waste segregation, management, and transportation. Volunteers will also collaborate with theatre groups to present street plays at strategic locations and promote the message of

waste management. The team will empanel local vendors, municipal workers, and citizens, who will be appointed as 'Safai Sathis,' to promote environmental awareness at the grassroots level. A volunteer march will also be organized in Puri one day before the Ratha Yatra to sensitise the local community on the need for responsible plastic waste

management.

Speaking about the waste management drive, Kamlesh Kumar Sharma, Chief Public Affairs and Communications Officer said "In the 25th year of HCCB's inception, we are also getting a chance to contribute to a plastic waste-free drive at the Ratha Yatra. More importantly, we get a stage to convey the message of waste segregation at the source and responsible disposal of solid waste to a large number of participants. We are pleased to associate with the organisers and the civil society in doing this work and it adds to our existing plastic waste collection drives through which we

collect more than 2500 metric tons of plastic waste in Odisha every year." Hindustan Coca-Cola has undertaken similar activities at other major festivals and events in the past, such as the Mission Green Sabrimala in Kerala, the Godavari Pushkaralu Festival in Andhra Pradesh and so on. The initiative ladders back to HCCB's goal of collecting 100% plastic that the company uses. In 2021, HCCB used 113,000 MT of plastic and collected 100% of it. This was made possible through its comprehensive plastic waste collection program which works towards creating a circular economy for plastics.



At 100, I'm happy breaking records

I have just returned from Vadodara after participating in the inaugural National Open Masters Athletics Championships and am told that I have created a national record for the 100m event by the oldest person. I covered the distance in 45.40s in the 100-plus age category. My second gold of the tournament came in 200m race with a timing of 1m 52.17s. I wanted to take part in other events also but was told that the organisers have capped the participation by one athlete to just two events. Though I am feeling very happy, I wish there was some competition. I happened to be the lone runner in both the races as there was no other entry in the 100-plus age category.

Honestly, it has been just over a year since I have started taking part in competitions on the insistence of my granddaughter, who is also a runner and regularly participates in the masters athletics meets. Had I known earlier that such competitions were held for people of my age, I would have given them a shot a long time back. But better late than never. In the last one year, I have travelled to Varanasi, Bengaluru, Badlapur in Maharashtra, Kerala and even Pokhara in Nepal. I have already lost count of the medals but can say that I have won most of the races. Apart from the thrill of competition and the joy of winning a medal, the one thing that excites me very much is predicting the winners during the competition. I love guessing who will win while the race is still on. My granddaughter Sharmila Sangwan (42) keeps a tab on the tournament schedule. The Masters Athletics Federation of India will release its schedule in November, after which I will start gearing up for future competitions.

I have had a busy season this year. The month of May was really hectic for me as there were three back-to-back tournaments in Nepal (May 1-5), Bengaluru (May 11-15) and Kerala (May 18-22), and then at Vadodara from June 16 to 19. As a result, I had to travel a lot. While many would advocate travelling by air as it is quick or by train as it is comfortable, I prefer to travel by our family car. It gives us the freedom to stop and move at will. Also, one does not feel the distance if the family is around. I do get tired, but that is only because of singing bhajans and folk songs endlessly on my family's demand. Now, I am happy to be back in the village.

Ever since my husband, Nihal Singh, died 23 years ago, I have been staying with my two sons, Mahender Singh and Mukhtiar Singh, at Kadma village in Charkhi Dadri district of Haryana, where my four daughters and their children visit me often. We are blessed to have a big and happy family. And since we are so close, someone or the other is always visiting. I consider myself lucky enough to have witnessed six generations of my family and spent time with them. I can proudly say that I have attended the marriages of my great grandsons and held their kids in my lap. I had just reached home from Vadodara when one of my great grandsons excitedly came up to me and said that he had seen my photo on the same page as that of Virat Kohli in the newspaper. It is nice to see that tinge of pride and joy in their eyes. Wherever I go to attend competitions, people keep asking me about the secret of my health, and I tell them it is happiness. I think if you try to live an energetic life, do not shirk responsibilities and enjoy what you do, you will remain hale and hearty. At this age, people suffer from arthritis, diabetes, blood pressure and other ailments, but I face no such health issues. I take no medicine.

I wake up around 5 am, offer morning prayers and tend to the cattle. Upon return, I perform daily ablutions and wash my clothes. Breakfast time is family time. We all have it together and then I either go to the nearby fields or catch up with the near and dear ones in the village. After lunch, I rest for a while and spend some time with the children in the house. Apart from cooking, I like to do all my work myself. My eating habits are simple. I eat whatever everyone in the family eats. Milk, curd, millets, rice, ghee, homegrown vegetables, it is traditional Haryanvi fare. By God's grace, I have not reached a stage where I have to be selective about the food I eat.

End of critical pedagogy

Not easy to celebrate the spirit of free enquiry in atmosphere of toxic nationalism

Who can resist the growing devaluation of humanities and social sciences, particularly when the society we live in is intoxicated with the glory of techno-science, and the aspiring class conditions its children to believe that the only meaning of existence is to pursue a career in medicine and engineering, and hence, except physics, chemistry, mathematics and biology, there is nothing worth learning? And the process of this devaluation has further been accelerated by the emergent politics of knowledge that in the name of rationalising the syllabus and reducing the 'academic burden' has deleted several significant topics from NCERT textbooks of classes VI to XII. Hence, as these new experts chosen by the ruling regime told us, our children should not know about, say, the Gujarat riots in 2002; nor is it required for them to be aware of the Narmada Bachao Andolan or the Naxalite movement. They also believe that it is not a good idea to enquire why women and sudras were prevented from studying the Vedas. Or for that matter, it is not necessary to know about the Mughal courts. And why should youngsters bother to know about the impact of globalisation on agriculture? Well, no great pedagogue would deny that the bombardment of the young mind with a heavy load of information is not a sign of meaningful education. Moreover, the NCERT texts are certainly not perfect; and the liberal-left intelligentsia that wrote it might have their biases. Yet, the way these texts have been damaged through a politically motivated process of deletion of select themes and issues would frighten every sensitive educationist. Indeed, it is an attempt to kill the liberating potential of critical pedagogy. This can be understood only if we recall the forgotten truth — the way disciplines like history, sociology and political studies have the capacity to open one's eyes, and make one see beyond the dominant commonsense of the age, and probe into the discourse of power. A reflexive mind endowed with a creatively nuanced critical consciousness is what social sciences ought to cultivate. Hence, the goal of history is not to force the child to memorise the dates of wars and treaties; instead, a sense of history should arouse a learner's interest in comprehending the major socio-cultural and techno-economic transformations that characterise the journey of the human race. And sociology is not about knowing a set of discrete facts about tribe, caste and family; instead, it is about asking critical questions — say, the way patriarchy, Brahminism and organised religions have often legitimised the subjugation of women, Dalits and the toiling masses. Or, an introduction to political studies does not mean that you ask a class XII student to memorise the Preamble of the Constitution, and vomit it in the examination; instead, it ought to encourage the young learner to ask why the spirit of the Preamble is denied every moment amid the might of



majoritarianism and gross socio-economic inequality. Have we forgotten the way some of our finest historians and social scientists — Irfan Habib and Ranjit Guha, Rajni Kothari and Ashis Nandy, or Irawati Karve and Vina Majumdar — wanted to expand our mental horizon?

Who would tell these experts who have damaged the NCERT texts that it is important for a school student to know and feel disturbed about the Gujarat riots because it was a severe blow to the cherished ideals of secularism and cultural pluralism? Who would tell them that children must know about the Narmada Bachao Andolan because this nonviolent environmental movement raised serious questions about the devastating consequences of what the nexus of the political class and the corporate elite regards as development? These experts have to be reminded of yet another fact: a true learner — a wanderer with freshness — should have the capacity to say that the Emperor is naked even if the sycophants all around think otherwise. From Hitler to Stalin, the taboo on critical pedagogy is inseparable from the cult of narcissism and authoritarianism. In fact, authoritarian masters all over the world, as history has demonstrated, are never comfortable with the kind of education that nurtures creativity, self-reflexivity and critical thinking. In a way, they need moral and intellectual dumbness. Or, in the

name of education, they need just a set of technical skills to run the techno-corporate machine. Or, they need 'disciplined' loyalists always ready to sing in tune with what the ruling regime dictates. Hence, what these experts have done with the NCERT texts seems to be in tune with what we are seeing everywhere — the arrogance of power and castigation of every dissenting voice as anti-national.

Is it possible to resist this trend and save education? Even though I loathe to be a pessimist, I must say that the obstacles are enormous. The fact is that in an atmosphere that continually breeds the ideology of toxic nationalism, it is not easy to celebrate the spirit of free enquiry. Moreover, when children's education, for all practical purposes, has been reduced to packaged 'success manuals' that coaching centres sell, and a bunch of toppers sponsor, why should you and I bother to think about emancipatory education? Yet, I would like to believe that there are still some teachers and parents amongst us who continue to inspire the youngsters to find the treasure of real knowledge in a different domain — not in the official curriculum, but in a living and vibrant mind that echoes with Rabindranath Tagore: 'Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high/Where knowledge is free...'

Abortion law in the US

Striking down 'Roe' judgment is a regressive step

By overturning the landmark 'Roe vs Wade' judgment of 1973, which had made abortion a constitutional right, the Supreme Court of the United States has taken a big step backward. The court, hearing a challenge to a Mississippi state law that sought to ban most abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy, upheld the ban by a 6-3 majority. The verdict, apart from further polarising the country between the liberals and the conservatives, will have a massive impact on the lives of women in the US — near-total ban on abortion will come into effect in the states ruled by the Republican Party, either immediately or 30 days after this verdict.

Nearly 50 years ago, the 'Roe' judgment had struck down laws that made abortion illegal in several states in the US, allowing abortion up to the point of 'foetal viability' — the point at which a foetus can survive outside the womb. That judgment gave women greater autonomy over their bodies, allowing them the choice to not have a child in case the circumstances



changed or they had second thoughts. Over the years, various studies have found that the abortion legalisation led to a reduction in the number of girls who became teen mothers, boosted women's education, labour force

participation and income. The opposition came from the Christian Right, for whom overturning the 'Roe' judgment was a mission due to their belief in the sanctity of life. It's a deeply political judgment, too — as far back as October 2016, Donald Trump, then the Republican presidential candidate, had said he'd nominate conservative judges to the Supreme Court and that would 'automatically' lead to the overturning of the 1973 judgment. This is exactly what has happened. It's obvious that the court has delivered a judgment which flies in the face of public opinion — according to the Pew Research Center, around 61% of the Americans support abortion under most conditions while 37% believe it should be illegal in the majority of the circumstances. Women's rights activists say that the court has taken away women's control over their bodies and their right to make a choice about something that can have a fundamental impact on their lives. They are right, because the court has delivered an ideological judgment instead of a kind and humane one.

Taliban complicity impacts India's Af policy

The terror attack by the IS-KP on the Karte Parwan gurdwara has resulted in Delhi putting on hold whatever initiatives had been envisaged by way of engaging with the Taliban regime in Afghanistan, while reviewing the larger security implications of this revival of the terror footprint.

The devastating earthquake that struck Afghanistan on June 22 has led to the death of over 1,100 persons and it is feared that this number could increase. Thousands have been rendered homeless and the destruction in the affected Paktika region is almost total. New Delhi, in keeping with its traditional commitment to the people of Afghanistan, has reached out to provide immediate humanitarian relief and assistance and on June 23, an Indian technical team reached Kabul to enable effective delivery to the victims. Despite the scale of the earthquake tragedy, the global isolation of the Taliban regime prevented a more robust international aid effort from reaching the victims and this remains the geopolitical cross that weighs down heavily on the people of Afghanistan. The return of the Taliban to power in Kabul in August 2021 after the hasty US withdrawal has compelled many nations to review and rewire their Afghanistan policies and India is no exception. Like many other nations, India has not accorded diplomatic recognition to the current Taliban regime in Kabul. But the potentially significant political overture by India in early June and the Islamic State terror attack on a local gurdwara that followed soon after merit review. On June 2, an official Indian delegation visited Kabul to coordinate the humanitarian assistance that Delhi had provided earlier in the year and this signalled a nuanced shift in the troubled bilateral relationship. The Indian Foreign Ministry issued a

carefully worded press note which highlighted the humanitarian assistance focus of the visit. The sub-text to be inferred is that the visit was an 'official' engagement with the Taliban for a limited purpose and not an endorsement of the regime. Acknowledging this aid, the Taliban encouraged India to reopen its mission in Kabul and resume direct flights to the country and also accept

Afghan military trainees — which is a case of resurrecting the traditional linkages that existed pre-August 2021. Given the enormous humanitarian crisis that has engulfed Afghanistan and the scant resources that the Taliban can muster — including skilled human resources (thousands of qualified Afghans have fled their nation, fearing retribution) — it is evident that the regime in Kabul is keen to have Delhi back as a dependable aid and development donor. In the aftermath of 9/11 (September 2001) and the gradual reconstruction of Afghanistan, many critical human security-related sectors were aided by India and in the last two decades, Delhi has provided \$3 billion worth of development sector aid. In addition, a large number of Afghan students have availed themselves of scholarships to study in India and thousands of Afghans visit India for medical treatment. However, this very nascent early June Indian engagement with the Taliban received a jolt with a terror attack on Karte Parwan gurdwara in Kabul a fortnight later (on June 18) that killed two persons. The attack was claimed by the IS-KP (Islamic State-Khorasan Province), which declared that this was "an act of support" for the Prophet and the targets were the minority Sikhs and Hindus in Afghanistan and the "apostates" who protected them. In a departure from their traditional antipathy to all other religions, the Taliban offered support for the reconstruction of the gurdwara, apart from announcing financial aid to those killed and injured. Further, they assured the minority community leaders that a "serious effort" would be made to ensure their safety from such attacks. This terror attack by the IS-KP has resulted in Delhi putting on hold whatever initiatives had been envisaged by way of engaging with the Taliban regime,



while reviewing the larger security implications of this revival of the terror footprint. India, it may be recalled, has been singled by Islamist terror groups with linkages to Afghanistan since December 1999 and these attacks include one on the Indian Parliament (December 2001) and a suicide attack on the Indian embassy in Kabul (July 2006). The Taliban at the time had provided shelter to Islamist terror groups that targeted India and, here, the role of Pakistan has compounded the Indian challenge. The Pakistan army and the ISI (its intelligence agency) mid-wifed the birth of the Taliban in the early 1990s and saw this Afghan group as an investment to furthering Rawalpindi's strategy of acquiring 'strategic depth' against India. The Pak army-Taliban axis saw India being marginalised in relation to Afghanistan and this has been an abiding security and geopolitical challenge for

Delhi. The tumultuous developments of the last quarter century that ravaged Afghanistan include the enormity of 9/11 and the al Qaida-Osama bin Laden saga, followed by the abrupt end to the US-led global war on terror (GWOT) in August 2021 that, ironically, brought the Taliban back to power in Kabul. Given the profile of the Taliban and a deep-seated anxiety about how they would conduct themselves, India, along with many other nations, evacuated its diplomats and citizens from Afghanistan and ostracised the regime. Paradoxically, the June 18 gurdwara attack by the IS-KP has introduced a shared security interest between India and the Taliban with respect to the IS-KP. This group, that has its origins in West Asia, appears to have embedded itself in Afghanistan and is reported to have reached a tactical accommodation with other Islamist terror groups in the surrounding regions. Periodic reviews by the UN Security Council's Monitoring Team on Afghanistan have noted the presence of al-Qaeda, Jaish-e-Mohammad and Lashkar-e-Taiba in the country and the role of the Haqqani network and, cumulatively, all these strands pose a security challenge to India that has been dealing with the state-supported terrorist scourge for decades. The fact that Sirajuddin Haqqani, a UN-designated global terrorist, is the interior minister in the Taliban regime points to the multilayered complexity that the Indian establishment has to contend with. In this maze of terror networks and state complicity in relation to Afghanistan, the close strategic relationship between China and Pakistan further shrinks the space for India. Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi hosted a meeting on March 31 of Afghanistan and its neighbours — that predictably excluded India — in the Anhui province of China and the participants collectively affirmed their support to the Taliban regime.

Pakistan staring at another fuel price hike in next fortnight

Islamabad, June 30 (UNI) The domestic prices of diesel and petrol in Pakistan are likely to be hiked by Rs16.89 and Rs 4.55 per litre, respectively, in the next fortnight, The News reported Thursday.

However, officials said that the petroleum levy (PL) and General Sales Tax (GST) will remain excluded from this price hike.

The price of diesel will witness a massive increase from July 1, 2022, if the government charges Rs10/litre on account of PL on diesel and petrol along with the GST.

The ex-depot price of petrol has been worked out at Rs238.44 for the next fortnight compared to Rs233.89/litre for the current fortnight, an increase of Rs4.55/litre.

If Rs10 PL and 17 per cent GST are added, the



petrol price will rise to around Rs290/litre from July 1, 2022.

The ex-depot price of diesel has been calculated at Rs280.20/litre for the next fortnight against Rs263.31/litre in the current fortnight, which translates into an increase of Rs16.89/litre. If Rs10 PL and 17% GST is included, the price of diesel may go up to Rs340/litre for the local consumers.

The government passed

Rs50 PL for every litre of petroleum products in the Finance Bill 2022-23 on Wednesday, as demanded by the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

The ex-depot prices of both fuels have been calculated based on their international market rates from June 14-28.

During the period under review, the price of crude oil fell by \$2.59/barrel; however, the price of products i.e.,

diesel and petrol went up by \$3.66 per barrel. The fall in the prices of crude oil won't benefit the consumers in the domestic market as the prices of diesel and petrol are linked to the global prices of these products rather than crude oil under the import parity price (IPP) mechanism.

According to sources in the sector, the government would pass on the impact of international prices to consumers

coupled with Rs10/litre PL.

However, it is expected that the government won't impose GST. But if it does it wouldn't be charged at the rate of 17 per cent in the next fortnight and will only be increased gradually. The local prices of diesel and petrol have peaked at their highest levels in the last one month after being kept frozen for three months as per the policy of the previous government to pay subsidy for keeping the prices stabilised.

The present government, however, abolished the subsidies on fuel prices on the IMF to re-qualify for Extended Fund Facility (EFF). The price hike has been the main issue between Pakistan and the IMF as part of an agreement to withdraw subsidies in the oil and power sectors to reduce the fiscal deficit before the annual budget is presented next month.

Sri Lanka seeks oil from Russia

Colombo, June 30 (UNI) Sri Lankan President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has reportedly written to Russian President Vladimir Putin desperately seeking urgent supplies of oil for his economically-battered country, a newspaper reported on Thursday.

The Daily Mirror quoted an unnamed source close to the President's Office as saying that Rajapaksa had urged Putin to extend "cooperation in oil purchases".

The two Presidents are expected to have a telephonic conversation one of these days and work out arrangements for an official visit to Moscow, it said.

Sri Lanka is now facing a huge fuel shortage, the



daily said.

According to the source, the shortage will last till July 10 as the next oil shipment can be expected between July 10 and 12. The source confirmed that India agreed to provide four shipments of fuel on cash payment.

Besides, the government has bought another 7,500 tonnes of diesel from the Lanka Indian Oil Company to be used for essen-

tial services until the next shipment arrives after July 4.

Sri Lanka is now unable to buy fuel from regular supplies since as much as \$731 million is in arrears to be paid to them for the previous supplies, the report said.

Sri Lanka is battling an unprecedented economic crisis leading to widespread shortages of food, fuel and medicines.

Pakistan reinstates Covid-19 guidelines amid spike in cases

Islamabad, June 30 (UNI) Authorities in Pakistan announced that they have decided to "fully activate" the National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC) guidelines in light of the rise in the number of Covid cases across the country once again, Khaleej Times reported on Thursday.

The NCOC is the agency leading the fight against

Covid-19 efforts in Pakistan. It is also responsible for making the policies and their implementation and also making suggestions to the Prime Minister's National Coordination Committee for timely actions related to the national Covid-19 response.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has also expressed concern over rising number of coronavirus cases

and wanted the implementation of safety measures.

The NCOC stopped functioning at the end of March after two years, while all its roles and responsibilities were handed over to the National Institute of Health (NIH).

The decision to revive NCOC comes as Pakistan's daily Covid-19 case count crossed the

500-mark for the first time in three months amid a constant rise in the recent countrywide spread of the disease, the NIH's data showed.

The country reported 541 new Covid-19 infections overnight, pushing Pakistan's positivity ratio above 3 per cent again. The new infections were detected after countrywide diagnostic testing on

15,462 samples, as per the data, reported Geo News. Meanwhile, the number of patients being treated in critical care units (CCUs) also surged to 100, while one person infected with Covid-19 died in the last 24 hours.

With the new additions, the total number of deaths rose to 30,392 and the number of active cases climbed to 5,269.

There is a FPO called Bagma Agri Producer Company Limited (BAPCL) here at Bagma in Udaipur subdivision of Gomati District guided by NABARD, Tripura Regional Office doing well under seed village project with the financial support of NABARD and technical support of ICAR to pro-

duce paddy seeds for the benefit of Tripura farmers at large in view to provide quality and environmentally satisfied paddy seeds for production in Tripura with low cost and minimum number of inputs, said Sudip Majumder, Chairman BAPCL.

The ICAR in Tripura has developed different varieties of rice seeds with the collaboration of farmers in Tripura. There are few varieties of rice namely Hakuchuku, Tripura Nirog, Tripura Chikan, Gomati and other varieties that are really demanded in state among farmers for unique qualities of these seeds and the FPO like BAPCL has been doing level best to go ahead with the guidance of ICAR Scientist Dr. S.P Das for the creation of more varieties of paddy seeds in Tripura in future.



Malaysia Open 2022: PV Sindhu gets off to a winning start, Saina Nehwal knocked out early

Kuala Lumpur India's PV Sindhu got off to a winning start at the Malaysia Open Super 750 tournament in Kuala Lumpur on Tuesday but veteran star Saina Nehwal was knocked out in the opening round.

Sindhu came through a tricky test against Thailand's Pornpawee Chochuwong in straight games. Sindhu looked sharp and switched on as she outclassed the World No. 10 shuttler 21-13, 21-17 to book her place in the second round. Notably, Sindhu, seeded 7th at the Malaysia Open, put behind the disappointment of the opening-round loss at Indonesia Open from earlier this month to come up with a dominant display. Sindhu will next face another Thailand shuttler in Pitthiaporn Chaiwan in the second round and faces a potential quarter-final meeting against her nemesis Tai Tzu Ying.

SAINA EXITS, PARUPALLI PROGRESSES Meanwhile, London Olympics bronze medallist Saina went down fighting against American Iris Wang, ranked 33rd in the world, 11-21 17-21 in 37 minutes.

It's been a series of disappointments for Saina, who has been hampered by fitness issues. The former World No. 1 has not managed to go past the second round in any of the tournaments she has played in 2022.

Meanwhile, veteran shuttler Parupalli Kashyap also progressed to the 2nd round in the men's singles field after beating Heo Kwang Hee of South Korea 21-12, 21-7.

On the other hand, B Sumeeth Reddy and Ashwini Ponnappa, who will be leading India's charge at the Commonwealth Games, also couldn't get past world number 21 pairing of Robin Tabeling and Selena Piek of the Netherlands, losing 15-21, 21-19, 17-21. Earlier on Tuesday, India's HS Prannoy progressed to the second round in men's singles after overcoming a stiff challenge from Malaysia's Daren Liew. However, Sai Praneeth and Sameer Verma were shown the door in the opening round.

Ireland vs India: VVS Laxman impressed with Irish fight in last-over thriller in 2nd T20I

New Delhi Former India batter VVS Laxman, who oversaw India's T20I series in the head coach role in Ireland, heaped praise on the Irish team, saying the fight shown by the hosts in the series, especially in the series finale in Dublin on Tuesday, June 28 impressed him.

Laxman said it's exciting to see young talents coming to the fore in Ireland cricket after Andie Balbrinie's men gave India a stiff test in the 2nd T20I in which 446 runs were scored in 40 overs. Chasing a steep target of 226, Ireland nearly got past the finish line as they finished just 4 runs short of India's total after a last-over thriller at the Malahide Cricket Club in Dublin on Tuesday. Captain Balbrinie hit a 37-ball 60 after opener Paul Stirling smashed 40 from just 18 balls.

Ireland were 142 for 4 in just the 14th over when 22-year-old Harry Tector, who had smashed an impressive fifty in the first T20I, joined hands with George Dockrell. The duo went on a six-hitting spree as there were a few nervous moments for the Indian camp in Dublin. While Tector hit a 28-ball 39, Dockrell led the fight at the death for Ireland, hitting 3 sixes and as many boundaries in his 16-ball 34 before lower-order batter Mark Adair hit 12-ball 23 not out. However, with Umran Malik successfully defending 17 runs in the final over, India completed a 2-0 sweep of the series. Laxman, who heads the National Cricket Academy, travelled with the Indian T20I squad to fill in for Rahul Dravid, who is overseeing India's preparations for the rescheduled 5th Test against England, starting July 1 in Birmingham. Notably, India's win on Tuesday was set up by Deepak Hooda, who hit his maiden T20I hundred and Sanju Samson, who shone on his comeback, hitting a quickfire 77 as India posted 225 on the board.

Been a long time coming: Fans elated after Sanju Samson scores his maiden T20I half-century for India

New Delhi Indian opener Sanju Samson smashed 77 off 42 balls against Ireland in the second T20I against Ireland in Malahide on Tuesday, 28 June. Samson, alongside Deepak Hooda, shared the largest T20I stand for India, putting 176 runs between them, beating the earlier best of Rohit Sharma and KL Rahul of 165 runs against Sri Lanka in 2017.

Touted to do great things when he debuted in 2015, Samson's career has been hit and miss for India. He has never quite been able to put strong performances on a consistent basis, which ended up translating into just 14 outings in the T20I format in the last seven years. However, that did not stop the crowd from giving Samson a loud cheer when captain Hardik Pandya announced his name at the toss, and the Rajasthan Royals captain paid back the trust with an exhilarating 77 off 42. In an innings where he played the second fiddle to Deepak Hooda's 104 off 57, Samson hit nine boundaries and four sixes. He was outfoxed by Mark Adair with a slower yorker which finished his outing in the second ball of the 17th over. Over the years, Samson has course corrected himself from a batter with supreme talent, to a mature team player with the ability to play mind boggling shots. He has been on the money with his batting at the Rajasthan Royals, a form he brought into the national side.

Wimbledon: Serena Williams stunned by Harmony Tan in first round

LONDON: Seven-time champion Serena Williams suffered a second straight Wimbledon first-round exit as she was stunned by French debutant Harmony Tan in a late-night Centre Court epic on Tuesday. A year after the American retired injured from what many feared would be her last Wimbledon match, her return had been eagerly anticipated but 115th-ranked Tan ripped up the script with a nerve-shredding 7-5 1-6 7-6(7) win. With the Centre Court roof closed for the final two sets and the time approaching the 11pm Wimbledon curfew, Tan had one match point snatched away when the 40-year-old Williams served at 5-6 in a rollercoaster deciding set. But Tan, who had never played a Wimbledon main draw match before let alone against one of the game's greats on a fever-pitch showcourt, was not done.

Sticking to the slice and slow ball shots that had flummoxed Williams throughout an absorbing duel, she clawed her way into a 9-7 lead before sealing victory as Williams netted a forehand. Williams, who had not played a singles match since retiring hurt against Aliaksandra Sasnovich here last

year, went through every emotion in three hours and 11 minutes of drama and put her fans through the wringer too. But in the end, a lack of match sharpness proved too much as another quest for a 24th Grand Slam title hit the buffers and the question is will she ever get another chance. Tan, who had only ever won two Grand Slam main draw matches compared to the 98 won at Wimbledon alone by Williams, could hardly believe what she had done after clinching by far the biggest victory of her modest career. "I'm so emotional now. Serena is a superstar and when I was young I was watching her so many times on the TV," the 24-year-old said on court. "For my first Wimbledon, it's wow. Just wow. When I saw the draw I was really scared. Because it's Serena Williams, she's a legend. I thought if I could win one or two games it was really good for me."

While defeat, which by ranking of opponent was the worst of her Wimbledon career, was a bitter pill to swallow, Williams said it was



easier to accept than last year. "It was definitely a very long battle and fight and it's definitely better than last year. That's a start," Williams told reporters. "I think physically I did pretty good. I think the last couple of points I was really suffering there." Asked if she would be back at Wimbledon, Williams was coy.

Despite wildcard Williams's notional ranking of 1,204, on paper the match looked like a mis-match. The 24-year-old Tan had only chalked up nine Tour wins in her career and none on grass compared to the 832 for

former world number one Williams.

But right from the start it was clear that statistics and reputations could be ignored. A succession of wild errors off the Williams racket handed Tan a 2-0 lead before she found some rhythm to move 4-2 ahead. But Tan, whose subtle game belongs to a bygone era, showed great court craft and broke the mighty Williams serve twice in succession on her way to snatching the opener. Williams broke serve after a lung-bustin 19-minute game early in the second set that had both players gasping and then saved four break points in the next game before rolling through the rest of the set as Tan faded.

Leading 3-1 in the decider Williams seemed in control but it was an illusion as Tan struck a beautiful backhand winner to break back for 3-3. Roared on by the crowd, Williams broke again at 4-4 and celebrated wildly as if she had won the title, but again Tan showed true grit and broke back with another stunning backhand.

Felt a million miles away: England's Eoin Morgan on deciding to retire ahead of the T20 WC in Australia

England's World Cup winning captain, someone who is well regarded for changing the culture of white-ball cricket in the country, Eoin Morgan decided to call time on his career.



New Delhi England captain Eoin Morgan decided to hang up his boots on Tuesday, 29 June. The World Cup-winning captain, who also led the team to the final of 2016 T20 World Cup in India stated that it was time for him to move on. Morgan, who has been woefully out of touch for close to two years now said that he chose not to extend his

international career till the T20 World Cup, because it would have been everything against what he had stood for. "It goes against everything I stand for, I just would have felt like an imposter," he said, when asked about an England farewell appearance. Morgan's retirement news was met with love and respect across English cricketing circles, who have held him in high regard since the 2015 debacle in the ODI World Cup in Australia. Morgan was at

the heart of a modern approach, which was considered to be data heavy, something very different from the ideas of English cricket at the time. "I'm very happy with my decision. The day it hit me I was emotional, it was a difficult day, but since then I've been very content. I'd reached the end of the road. The World Cup is in October and the feeling that day, it felt a million miles away."

Eoin Morgan will now join Sky's commentary team and going forward wants to work in an administrative position in English cricket. "I don't spend a lot of time in the boardroom, so I don't know how that would work, but I'm doing a course at the moment to allow me to sit on a board at some stage," he said. A veteran of 248 ODI internationals, Morgan scored 7701 runs at an average of 39. He hit 14 centuries and 47 fifties. He was also a part of 115 T20Is and 16 Test matches.

I had never opened in my life: Deepak Hooda explains 'warrior' mentality behind success with Indian team

New Delhi Indian top order batsman Deepak Hooda won the player of the series award after his two stunning performances with the bat. The Lucknow Super Giants batter, who has been in stunning form was asked to open the bat in the first game in place of Rituraj Gaikwad and turned up with a stroke-filled 47 off 29 balls in a rain-marred game. The batter did not stop there and hit a magnificent 104 off just 57 balls in his second outing and had a record-breaking 176-run stand with Sanju Samson, peaking at the press conference after the series. Hooda revealed that he had not opened at any level before this, but once an opportunity is given, it is foolish to say no. "Leave international, I have never opened in my life. (Chuckles) But yes, being a top order batsman, you have to take on the challenges that you are presented with, you have to cope up with them. You do not have an option, and if you do not have an option then why don't you go out there like a warrior."

That's how I think. I was ready for that and things were working my way. I am happy about that. "Asked about if he was elated after his outings, Hooda said that it was important to remain grounded. "I have learned lately that a player should not be



going ahead of himself. One has to live in the moment and if your process and ethics are right, you will do well." Indian team under the tutelage of Rahul Dravid is yet to finalise the squad for the T20 World Cup and Hooda's knock and his ability to access all parts of the ground provides a lot of flexibility to the batting unit. Asked about his approach against the short balls, Hooda revealed that he loves to take them on. "I like

short balls. When you go to Australia, they play very good competitive cricket, that's where they bowl at you." India would now be moving to England to play a white-ball tour after the rescheduled Test match. Dravid has said before that he would like to finalise the 18-20 people for the ICC tournament in Australia soon and the England tour would be a litmus test for many players in the Indian squad.

Run up to T20 WC will be entertaining: Deepak Hooda's magical form keeps selectors on the edge of their seats

Indian batter Deepak Hooda became the fourth centurion for India in the T20 format, after his breathtaking 104 off 57 balls against Ireland at Malahide on Tuesday, 28 June. Hooda's ability to access all parts of the ground without losing his shape awed the fans in the packed stadium in Ireland as India made merry and put up 225 runs in 20 overs, largely due to the partnership between Hooda and Sanju Samson.

With the T20 World Cup approaching in Australia later this year, and the initial India squad yet to be finalised, fans flocked to their social media to express



their support for the Lucknow Super Giants batter who has been in stunning form since April 2022.

Hooda was awarded with a spot in the Indian side after his brilliant form in the IPL, a tournament where he was solely responsible for acceleration in the middle overs for LSG. The Rohtak born repaid the faith of the selectors, hitting a stroke filled 47 off 29 balls in the first match and then turning up with a century in the second one.

The player had the likes of Aakash Chopra and Sanjay Manjrekar in awe, who took to Twitter to express their support to the player. "Deepak Hooda owned this series. Totally. And he happens to be the man who's not got enough chances but how do you accommodate him when the senior guys are back? Run-up to the World Cup is going to be really entertaining," wrote Chopra. What a phenomenal rise it's been for Deepak Hooda! Unique way of creating opportunities for big hitting. Steps out at the last second to surprise the seam bowlers. Ends up hitting boundaries off good balls bowled in the stumps. Nightmare for bowlers," Manjrekar expressed. India have tough competition in the batting order going into the World Cup and it will be made further difficult if the squad, especially its senior members, remain fully fit. With the likes of Rohit Sharma, KL Rahul and Virat Kohli occupying the top three positions, it will be interesting to watch that how the Indian team manages to make its selection calls for the T20 World Cup.

It's pure, clean tennis: Fourth Seed Stefanos Tsitsipas breaks first round hoodo at Wimbledon

This was Alexander Ritschard's first ever tour level match. The Swiss international bothered Stefanos Tsitsipas throughout the game. Tsitsipas predicted that the world will be seeing a lot more of the 28-year-old

New Delhi Greek international, and the fourth seed in the prestigious Wimbledon tournament, Stefanos Tsitsipas advanced to the second round of the competition, beating 188th ranked Alexander Ritschard on Tuesday evening, June 28. Tsitsipas, who comes fresh from his win at Mallorca against Roberto Bautista Agut, was given a scare in the first round of the grass court competition when Ritschard got a big lead in the first set. As the memories of first round exits loomed fresh in the minds of the Tennis fans, Tsitsipas just about did enough to eke out a result, winning the match 7-6(1) 6-3 5-7 6-4. The first few minutes of the match had Tsitsipas wildly gesturing to himself, unable to figure out his opponent, who had taken a 4-1 lead.

However, the pep talk seemed to have done the trick and the Greek international tore through his Swiss challenge to pick the first set 7-6. As the game went through, it looked like the fourth seed was going to get this done



smoothly, however, he lost the third set of the game 5-7. However, the crucial break did not do the 28-year-old any good, as Tsitsipas marched into the second set with ease, winning the fourth set 6-4 comfortably. Speaking after the game, the Greek said that he came into the competition with a lot of confidence and was loving the surface. "Well, it definitely helps having a victory before a big event like this. Grass court here is completely different. It's perfect. You never get misbounces, which sometimes can help and sometimes doesn't

really help that much. It's pure, clean tennis. I haven't had the privilege of starting Wimbledon with a title before the week before. That gives me a lot of confidence on having a strong start this year. Points or no points, I approach it, I try and approach it the same way. I'm playing for just the idea that Wimbledon has to offer," the 23-year-old said. "Yeah, it made me kind of fall in love more with the surface. I like playing on grass. Having tournament wins on surfaces elevates you, puts you in a better mood, as well. It is very good for your self-esteem, and that's how I have been feeling. It's important to feel that way, especially when you are competing at the highest level of tennis. You know, winning titles can really boost your confidence and help you capture bigger titles later on in your career. You've got to start small. You don't go big straightaway unless, I don't know, unless we take girls as an example, they seem to be doing that straightaway."


